
competition. They will be awarded their £10 book vouchers when we come back after Easter.






Safety Zone for Year 5

On Wednesday 9th March, the Year 5 children attended a Safety Challenge at March Fire Station. They carried out a range of activities, and learned about the importance of keeping safe in a variety of circumstances, which included: when being a passenger in a car, when playing near water, the steps to take if they were involved in a house fire, and a demonstration from St. John's Ambulance which taught them how to correctly apply a bandage. The children were each presented with a safety goodie bag at the end of the afternoon.

8th March - Class 4 Stibbington Visit - Evacuation Day



On Tuesday 8th March, Class 4 had an amazing trip to Stibbington. They dressed up as evacuees and used role play to empathise with children who were evacuated from London in the 1940s.

Upon arrival at Nene Valley Railway Station, the children were escorted to a railway carriage where staff, in the role of billeting officers, welcomed them to the countryside. During a walk to Stibbington Centre, Class 4 found out about homes where they might have been billeted to, and about life in the countryside during wartime Britain. The afternoon took place in the period classroom, and involved

the children having lessons which included: a gas mask drill, singing, spelling and arithmetic.
