MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNORS

Did you know?.....

From 1st October 2015 the ban on smoking in cars with children in England and Wales has come into effect. It is now illegal to smoke in a vehicle with anyone under the age of 18 and both the smoker and the driver could be fined £50.

The current law states:

All children travelling in a car must use the correct car seat appropriate to their weight or height, until they are either

- 135 cm in height or
- 12 years in age whichever they reach first

After this point they must use an adult seatbelt

It might seem like a convenient place to drop off the children but new figures show the number of tickets issued for stopping on the zig-zags outside schools have almost doubled in 2 years.

But it seems only 17% of people know stopping on zig-zags is banned at school run times, AXA car insurance research says. While it may be well known that you can't <u>park on yellow zig-zag lines</u>, you also can't <u>wait or even stop momentarily</u> to drop off or pick up passengers, according to the UK Highway Code.

The Local Government Association explains that this is because parking on yellow zig-zags outside schools puts children at risk as outside school gates there are lots of children running around, buggy congestion and little ones on scooters and bikes.

We would also like to remind you all that there is also a **20mph** speed limit outside the school between 8:30 to 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 to 3:30 p.m.

Coffee Mornings

This term I have been running a coffee and cake session on alternate Monday mornings. The sessions are open to any parent (or grandparent) and are very informal. We tend to have a loose focus for each session and so far we have discussed Phonics, Numeracy and touched on homework.

The next session will be on Monday 9th November and the parents who attended this week have requested that we talk about grammar. The session starts around 9a.m. once the children are in school and usually lasts for approximately an hour. Everyone is welcome.

World Heart Day

On Tuesday September 29th Mrs Strong and Mrs Godly took 15 year 6 children to Cromwell for a day full of activities relating to the heart.

The first activity was a lesson on the history of medicine from Georgian and Victorian times. The children learned about the kinds of treatments that were available, including putting potatoes next to the neck to cure a cold and cutting off a leg or arm to prevent infection - usually when the patient was still conscious and being held down.

After break, the children went to the art room where they designed and produced a clay heart which was fired in the kiln for them to paint at a later date.

The third activity was a lesson about the heart and how blood travels around the body to provide oxygen. The children were then given a lambs' heart and worked in small groups to cut into the heart to see the chambers and tubes around the heart. Most children enjoyed this activity, but those who chose

not to participate were able to measure their heartrates after completing various exercises in the corridor!

After lunch the children moved onto their last lesson which was in the sports hall and definitely got their hearts racing with continuous circuit training activities for half an hour, which included shuttle runs, press ups, stomach crunches and step ups.

It was a really enjoyable day in which the children gained a lot of useful information, not to mention sore muscles!

On Monday the 26th September Class 1 enjoyed a 'Teddy Bears Picnic' in the afternoon. Grandparents were invited to join in the fun and games. We all brought in our teddies from home and shared stories about them with the class. The children spent the morning making jam sandwiches and biscuits.
