
- ▶ Can you recognise each of the characters?

Main Clause

- ▶ A main clause is a group of words that contains a verb and a subject which makes complete sense on its own.
- ▶ A main clause can form a complete sentence on its own. They have a subject and a predicate which are the 2 main parts of a sentence. A predicate adds information about the subject.
- ▶ **Examples of a main clause:**
- ▶ In the following examples, the main clause is in green while the subordinate clause is in pink

The girls fed the ducks
before they walked around the lake.

The windmill sails turned quickly
because it is very windy today.



Subordinate Clause

- ▶ A subordinate clause is a clause that cannot stand alone as a complete sentence but is linked to the main clause using a subordinating conjunction. It does not express a complete thought and requires additional information if read on its own.
- ▶ For example, in the sentence 'I played out until it went dark', 'until it went dark' is the subordinate clause as it requires additional information in order to make sense. Subordinate clauses contain a subject noun and a verb.
