





# Puns

- A word in a sentence that can have two meanings.
- This word is called a Homophone this is a word that sounds the same as another but is spelt differently and has a different meaning
- For example Write/right, Bare/bear, Flower/flour, Hare/Hair.



- Peace of cake
- Sew it's time
- Bare face liars
- Christmas shoppers stocking up
- Witch Halloween costume is for you

### Letter play (play on words)

• Sometimes writer will change a letter or a part of the word to give a double meaning.

Examples...

- Truck by lightning
- Tantastic!
- A jab well done.

#### Alliteration

 Often using the same letter sound at the start of your words can create an interesting effect.

Examples...

- Sending up the stars and stripes.
- Greedy girl gobbles gruel.
- Big bad bear bites boy.

- Hare affair.
- Tissue issue.
