

Geograph Website Guidance

Using www.geograph.org.uk "This day in past years"

1. Navigate to www.geograph.org.uk
2. Click onto "Explore" and then on "This day in past years".
 - The content here changes daily so you will need to check the site on the day of teaching to ensure content is suited to the lesson task.
 - If there are no suitable images, see "Searching www.geograph.org.uk for an Image" below.
 - It is helpful if children choose a location with a road – it will make it much easier to find the modern equivalent view!
Enter the location of your image, e.g. Wilbury Villas, Hove.

Searching www.geograph.org.uk for an Image

1. Navigate to www.geograph.org.uk
2. Type a place name in the search box at the top of the page.
 - It is helpful if children choose a larger town or city, as this gives them a much greater chance of them finding an old image.
3. Click "Over time" to sort the images by the decade in which they were taken.
4. Click on the decade to see the images in each group.
 - It is helpful if children choose a location with a road – it will make it much easier to find the modern equivalent view!

Once You Have Found an Image at www.geograph.org.uk

Note: It is helpful if children choose a location with a road – it will make it much easier to find the modern equivalent view!

1. Copy and paste the image into your software by either:
 - using a screen clipping tool to copy the area of the screen showing the image;
 - downloading a copy of the image to your computer by right clicking on the image (check the terminology used in your own internet browser);
 - or using the copy image option (check the terminology used in your own internet browser).
2. Look at the information above the image on the Geograph website to find out where the image was taken. The information below the image will tell you when it was taken.

3. Below the image is more information about when and where the image was taken.
 - The view direction may help you to support children in finding the same modern location.

Using www.google.co.uk/maps to find a StreetView

1. Navigate to www.google.co.uk/maps
2. Enter the location of your image, e.g. Wilbury Villas, Hove.
3. Drag the little yellow man onto the street.
4. Click to navigate along the street until you find the scene you are looking for.
 - Google Street View shows an insert of a map on the screen. The grey arrow by the yellow man icon shows which direction you are looking (with North at the top of the insert) Click "Over time" to sort the images by the decade in which they were taken.
5. Use a screen clipping tool to copy and paste the image into your software.
